



MEAT CLASSIFICATION COURSE INFO

SAMIC is a dynamic National based company that must keep up with the rapid changes of a new business environment. Being a Government Assigned Company, SAMIC must align itself with the priorities of Government.

How do I get started

To become a meat classifier, a person needs to undergo training in meat classification. The learner needs to complete a theoretical and practical evaluation by SAMIC. Any person with at least grade 12 can register for the program. Any applicant needs to register with a service provider before he/she can start with the Meat Classification Course.

How to register for the New Meat Classification Course

1. Fill in the enrollment form and e-mail it to rudivdw@samic.co.za
2. You will receive an invoice with the banking details of SAMIC.
3. Pay the amount in the SAMIC account and send proof of payment to rudivdw@samic.co.za or fax it to 012-361 9837. Please mark the proof of payment clearly for attention Orpa Thirion.
4. SAMIC Head Office will verify payment.
5. After confirming the payment, The Meat Classification Learning Material will be sent via Speed Services
6. The learner needs to study on his/her own time. When ready, the learner can arrange with one of our Regional Auditing Inspectors in their area to write the assessment.
7. Your theory assessment results will be available immediately. After successful completion of the theory assessment, a date and venue can be arranged with the Regional Auditing Inspector from SAMIC for the practical assessment at a high throughput abattoir on the specie of their choice.

Pass Rate

Once the applicant is of the opinion that he/she is ready for a theoretical assessment, the applicant will have to do two separate assessments. The pass rate for these assessments is a minimum of **50%** on the **Meat Classification Manual** and a minimum of **75%** for the **Red Meat Classification Regulations**.



If you do not achieve a passing score on an assessment the first time, you must wait at least 5 days before retaking the next assessments. If you do not achieve a passing score the second time, you must wait at least a 14 day period before retaking the assessment a third time. A 14-day waiting period will also be imposed for the fourth and fifth subsequent assessment retakes. You may not take a given assessment any more than five times per year.
